Every five years, North Florida School of Special Education scrubs and polishes each physical surface and underlying educational standard with great anticipation for re-accreditation by the Florida Council of Independent Schools (FCIS). The preparation process was extensive, but accreditation positions us for future growth that is focused and intentional. Through FCIS we completed a strategic plan with board members, staff, parents, and community stake holders. We examined our core values including community involvement and replication of services. In February, a FCIS Team evaluated NFSSE and granted full accreditation for another five years. With FCIS credentials, NFSSE exceeds rigorous standards for financial stability and quality education.

Governor Ron DeSantis chose North Florida School of Special Education to hold two press conferences this year!
